The Photo Archives at the Palace of the Governors in collaboration with the Marion Center for Photographic Arts at the College of Santa Fe presents a lecture by Lucy Lippard, as the first speaker in a year long series of lectures held in conjunction with Through the Lens: Creating Santa Fe an exhibition at the Palace of the Governors that opens on November 21, 2008 and runs through October 25, 2009. A satellite exhibition, Through the Lens: A Contemporary View of Santa Fe will be on view at the Visual Arts Gallery, Santa Fe Community College from January 29 – March 9, 2009.

Lucy R. Lippard is one of the essayists for the publication, *Through the Lens: Creating Santa Fe* published by the Museum of New Mexico Press. The book will be available at the end of January 2009. Critic, writer, lecturer, teacher, and curator of exhibitions in the field of contemporary art, Lippard is also a political activist and feminist. She was a founder of several feminist art organizations including WEB, The Women's Art Registry, and *Heresies: A Feminist Publication on Art and Politics*. Among her books are *Pop Art* (1966), *Six Years: The Dematerialization of the Art Object* (1973), *The Lure of the Local: Senses of Place in a Multicentered Society (1998), On the Beaten Track: Tourism, Art,*

and Place (1991), Overlay: Contemporary Art and the Art of Prehistory (1983), Get the Message?: A Decade Of Art For Social Change (1984), and Mixed Blessings: New Art in a Multicultural America (1990).
